Education

In the month of December, we had four classes from Fairglen Elementary come to visit Field Manor on a field

ages would have worn around the turn of the century, and they loved being able to take home a plant they potted themselves. The teaching staff can't wait for the return trip next school year!

On Friday, December 14th, Field Manor hosted our firstever Homeschool History Day. Targeting an age group of 7-11, we plan to host these Homeschool History programs multiple times throughout the year to reach out to more students within Brevard County. This month's theme revolved around holiday traditions, so students received a tour of the homestead and then created paper decorations comparable to those the Field family could have made when they lived on-site. The children also decorated cookies and had time to play both historic and non-historic outdoor activities. We had over 20 in attendance between our two sessions and received excellent feedback from the homeschool learning communities. We plan on having another Homeschool History Day in February or March. Field Family Christmas

On Sunday, December 16th, Field Manor hosted our third annual Field Family Christmas event. For three hours, we open the homestead for an open house-style tour and

decorate each room floor to ceiling with historically accurate Christmas decorations for the Victorian Era. In the late 1800s, the Field family would have stuffed their rooms full of greenery



collected from their groves. To honor this tradition, our staff and volunteers stuffed the fireplaces with pine branches and magnolia leaves. We also dotted the mantles with hand-picked oranges from our trees. In addition to the decorations, guests were treated to caroling as well as cookies and hot chocolate.

From year to year, about 50 guests who have never been to Field Manor visit us for this Christmas event. This year, we far exceeded even our expectations when over



250 people flooded Field Manor between 1-4pm that Sunday afternoon. Lines formed around the homestead as cars continued to descend our long driveway. Field Family Christmas 2018 set new attendance records for Field Manor, and our staff had a blast bringing it to life. Thank you to all of our incredible volunteers: Maria, Krista, Jen, Nancy, Kim,
